Public transport in Bristol

**By bus, train,
plane or boat**



By road or water, Bristol is well-connected. You'll be able to easily navigate the city centre by hopping on the bus, renting an e-scooter or even jumping on a boat across the river!

If heading outside of the city centre, you may need to plan your journey in advance as public transport arrives less often. Bus and train passes are available daily, weekly, monthly and annually, use the [journey planner](#) to work out your route and buy tickets for the bus from [First Bus](#) website. For train tickets, we recommend using [The TrainLine](#) or downloading their app.

National rail, air and coaches

It's easy to navigate across the UK from Bristol, including to Wales due to being so close to this neighbouring country. Bristol Airport has flights to Istanbul, Dublin, Edinburgh, Barcelona, Lisbon and more.

Each term in an education setting is usually 13 weeks long, with a week off halfway through, called half term.

You can expect around two weeks off at the end of term one and term two, for Christmas and Easter respectively. When the school year ends, you can expect six weeks off for the summer holidays.

Each region of the UK varies with its exact term dates, so please see this as a rough guide. You'll often find Year 11s and Year 13s may finish earlier, depending on where their last exams fall. For more detailed curriculum information, head to [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) or check your local council's website for specific term dates.
