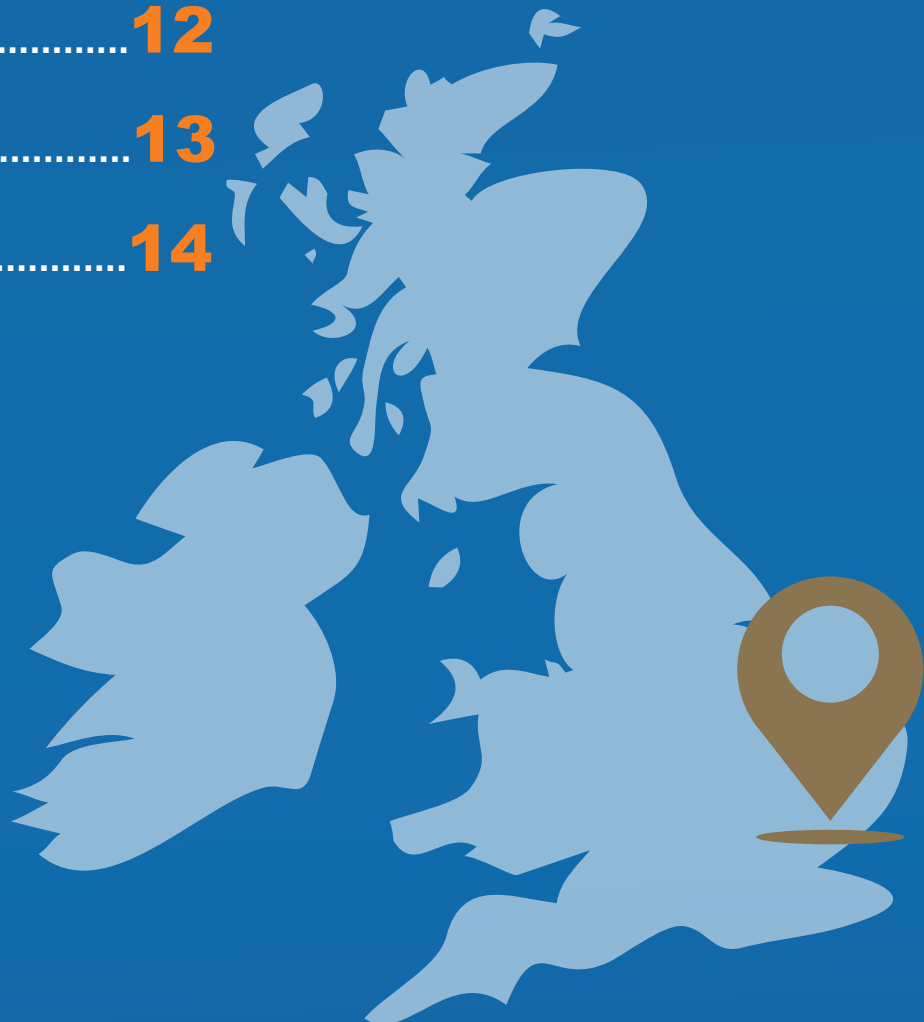

Essex may be home to Britain's oldest recorded town in Colchester, but those cobbled streets are full to the brim with great amenities, gastro delights, pleasant parks and vibrant nightlife which will rival the hustle and bustle of nearby London life.

Outside of Colchester, some areas in Essex to relocate to include:

Cost of living

The cost of renting or owning a place will vary depending on location, with smaller towns costing less on average than cities in Essex. The following costs are for Colchester and taken as an average.

Single public transport ticket £2

Monthly rent of one bedroom apartment in city centre £833.33

Monthly rent of one bedroom apartment outside of city centre £783.33

One month of basic utilities (electricity, water, heating) £183.70

One month childcare at nursery or pre-school £1,000

Three course meal for two at a mid-range restaurant £70

One month gym membership £37.50

Weekly grocery shop £35

Public transport in **Essex**

By bus, train    **and taxi**

Different towns and cities have different bus providers, however PLUSBUS passes can be purchased to use on buses and trains across Essex. There is also a Colchester Borough card for unlimited bus travel across Colchester.

National Rail, air and coaches

There are 80 train stations across Essex, meaning a trip to the beach, the countryside or even the capital of London is easily accessible. Be sure to purchase your ticket in advance either at a ticket machine or online/on app ahead of boarding the train.

The closest airport to Essex is London Stanstead airport (14.4m/23km away) which is easily accessible by train.

The UK Education System

Each term in an education setting is usually 13 weeks long, with a week off halfway through, called half term.

You can expect around two weeks off at the end of term one and term two, for Christmas and Easter respectively. When the school year ends, you can expect six weeks off for the summer holidays.

Each region of the UK varies with its exact term dates, so please see this as a rough guide. You'll often find Year 11s and Year 13s may finish earlier, depending on where their last exams fall. For more detailed curriculum information, head to [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) or check your local council's website for specific term dates.
