#### **Our mission**

Serious about fundraising, not so serious when we do it...

Our mission is to use our unwavering passion for people to support and uplift others through causes close to our hearts, while creating unique and engaging fundraising activities.

#### **Supporting communities since 2004**

TeacherActive believes that Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) is important, and that companies should do their bit to give back to local communities as part of this. For several years, TeacherActive has supported a number of local and national charities, including Cystic Fibrosis Trust, Children in Need, and Show Racism the Red Card. During the 2023-2024 academic year, we supported 24 charities, 16 of those local to our branches. We also donated a £10,000 grant to Groundwork who are committed to nurturing green spaces around the UK.



#### **Charity initiatives**

Giving back is in our nature. We want to ensure we do our bit for those who need it most and support our teams to do so too. Supporting charities has naturally become a staple in our company culture; this is evident in the national events we host for our teams to take part in along with these five initiatives.

**CF Trust X3:** Our designated, company-wide charity is Cystic Fibrosis Trust, who we fundraise for in memory of a dear friend and colleague Andy Elliott. For the last two years, we have run our CF Trust x3 initiative, tripling every pound that our teams raise for this charity.

**Charity Day:** To champion our teams in supporting charities close to them, we provide an extra day of paid annual leave to take part in charitable causes.

**Active Impact:** We encourage our teams across England and Wales to partner with a local charity of their choice and support them with funds donated by TeacherActive. This is supplemented by the charity day given to all team members.

The Charity Cup: A healthy competition in which teams earn points for their charity efforts across the academic year. The team who gains the most points wins an outdoor learning area for a school of their choice, supplied by a partner organisation called Groundwork.

**Event spotlight:** We strongly encourage our internal teams to give back to causes they care about with complete backing from their colleagues. We have a weekly good news platform called Props where we promote all charity events, company-led or driven by a team member, elevating awareness and gaining sponsorship from directors, sales and support team members alike.

#### **Charity Task Force**

Rebecca has always had a passion for supporting charities and throughout the years has completed sponsored runs, a skydive and volunteered at sanctuaries abroad. Each year, Rebecca crochets blankets and buys toys and treats to donate over 400 gift bags to her local dog and cat shelters. Rebecca joined the Charity Task Force in 2023, supporting event creation and promotion and organising the Charity Cup.



#### **Sophie Hack - Marketing Executive**

Sophie joined the charity team in 2022 and supports in event creation, marketing charity events and monitoring charity engagement through the Charity Cup. In 2023, Sophie took part in the Tough Mudder challenge for Cystic Fibrosis Trust and in 2024 saw another chance to get muddy by helping to build an outdoor learning area for a school in Birmingham.



# Our national charity events

#### September 2023 - July 2024

We are proud to have fostered a strong community within TeacherActive. With over 200 staff and a dedicated Charity Task Force we are able to build structure around charity events, creating some healthy competition while the team found inventive and exciting ways to get involved.

To ensure maximum involvement and inclusion, this year's events focused on accessibility. We created events in which everyone could get involved no matter their location or ability. Events also had levels of participation, meaning people could get involved as little or as much as they liked and were still able to make a difference.



## Our national charity events

#### September 2023

#### The Great Blue and Orange Cake Off for Macmillan Cancer Support

We hosted an 'Is It Cake?' style challenge where our team baked realistic cake creations. From coffee cups to colleague's heads, shoes to spaghetti, the designs looked almost too good to eat! From this coffee morning, we raised £739 for Macmillan Cancer Support.



#### October 2023

#### Wear Red Day for Show Racism the Red Card

Wear Red Day is a staple event in the TeacherActive calendar, where we collaborate with our diversity and inclusion team, Empower, during Black History Month. Show Racism the Red Card campaign for anti-racism resources and information in schools, using influential people like footballers to help spread their message.

Every year, the team wears red and donates to Show Racism the Red Card. We combined this with Empower's Cookout, asking people to bring in dishes such as food from the Caribbean, Somalia and Ghana where everyone had the opportunity to try food from around the globe. From these activities, we raised £230.

#### November 2023

#### Movember

14 team members from England and Wales took part in Movember, a challenge involving growing moustaches throughout November. Movember is a leading men's charity focusing on mental health and suicide prevention along with prostate and testicular cancer. The team doubled their fundraising efforts compared to the previous year and raised £630.



#### Children in Need

In the same month, we hosted a Pudsey Pyjama Party to raise money for Children In Need. Inspired by a classic sleepover, teams had to give someone a makeover while blindfolded, with the best winning Charity Cup points. From this we raised £283.



#### December 2023

#### **Christmas Music Video for Cash for Kids**

We tasked the team with recreating a classic Christmas music video to share the festive spirit while donating toys or money to Cash for Kids. The charity strives to ensure no child goes without a present to open on Christmas day. We raised cash and donated toys equating to £130 in total.



## Our national charity events

#### February 2024

#### **FeBrewary for Cystic Fibrosis Trust**

FeBrewary was our first event of the year for our chosen charity Cystic Fibrosis Trust, which raises funds and campaigns for resources and support for those living with the lung condition Cystic Fibrosis, along with their families.

We asked teams to bring in a board that was either blue, orange or yellow themed – including drinks, snacks and treats. The best-looking board would win Charity Cup points while the other teams could enter raffles to win the boards. From this event, we raised £535.50.



#### March 2024

#### **Easter Bonnet Competition for National Book Tokens**

To celebrate World Book Day, we gave our schools a worksheet where pupils could draw a story-themed Easter bonnet. The school with the best design won National Book Tokens. Through this, we donated £400 in vouchers.







#### **May 2024**

#### Wear it Green for Mental Health Foundation

For the second Empower collaboration of the year, we fundraised for the Mental Health Foundation during Mental Health Awareness Week. On the 14th of May, everyone was asked to wear green and donate while offices took part in a step challenge. Empower also delivered discussion events and resources to support positive mental health. From this, we raised £683.



#### **June 2024**

#### **Dance-a-Thon for Cystic Fibrosis Trust**

Every year in June, Cystic Fibrosis Trust hosts a national Wear Yellow Day which we are honoured to take part in. To set an extra challenge, the team needed to dance for over 100 hours combined, gaining sponsorship and donations for busting a move. This event raised £779 for Cystic Fibrosis Trust.



#### **July 2024**

#### The Big Fat Quiz of the Year for Cystic Fibrosis Trust

Our final event was inspired by the ever-popular TV show quiz of the same name, complete with a TeacherActive round and a guess the song sung by our Chief Sales Officer Lisa Dovey. Our quiz was hosted on the last day of term as a way to celebrate our team's hard work throughout the academic year. This last event raised £430 for our charity partner.





# **Groundwork and the Charity Cup**

Since the 2022-2023 academic year, we have injected some healthy competition in the form of an engagement strategy called the Charity Cup. All of our events throughout the academic year had points assigned for certain challenges; the team that won the most points would win an outdoor learning area for their school costing £10,000, built by Groundwork.

2022 – 2023's Charity Cup winner was the **West Midlands** team, who chose Annie Lennard Primary School in Smethwick to win the learning area. Before the build, the school had no green space for children and many lived in residential areas with no garden. The space now includes outdoor seating, a storytelling chair and bug hotels, which allows the children to have some downtime outside of the classroom and the opportunity to learn in a new and engaging environment.

## **Groundwork and the Charity Cup**

The West Midlands team had the opportunity to help build the area with support from Groundwork. Over two days they got stuck in with flattening the ground, turning the soil and building fences to make this area come to life. The team had a fantastic time and we are thrilled to have built this outdoor area, complete with benches, bug hotels and a storytelling chair for one of our schools.

Kimberley Sirett, School Business Manager, said:

"It feels fantastic because when I look at the before pictures of the space and now see what it is today it's just amazing that it's finished, and we can start using the space. It's an area unlike anywhere else in the school, I think being able to explore and enrich their activities and their lessons is going to be amazing for [the pupils]."

For the 2023 - 2024 academic year, we teamed up with Groundwork again to donate another outdoor learning area. The latest Charity Cup winner entered every single competition, coming first place in the Dance-a-Thon and the Step Challenge for Mental Health Foundation.
